

DRY TOILET

- You are currently using a dry toilet, which is environmentally friendly and an economical option for a normal water-using WC.
- A well-kept dry toilet doesn't smell and it's comfortable to use.
- By composting the dry toilet waste, the nutrients can easily be utilized, e.g. as fertilizer for plants. No actual waste is produced.
- The dry toilet doesn't produce any wastewater. The purification of wastewater requires expensive equipment and a lot of energy, which wastes the natural resources.

HOW TO USE A DRY TOILET?

- **ADD SOME LITTER (dry peat/sawdust) AFTER EVERY USE!** It will speed up the decomposition of the toilet waste and help with the smell control. If there is no litter, inform the person in charge about it.
- To minimize the smells, **close the cover** of the dry toilet after use.
- **Don't put any such waste to the dry toilet that doesn't belong there, e.g. plastic.** Put diapers and sanitary towels to a trashcan or take them to the nearest waste disposal-collecting tank.
- Make sure that you leave the dry toilet clean after use, so that the following users can also use the toilet comfortably.
- You can also put other biological waste to the dry toilet, e.g. fruit shells.
- If you notice any problems or shortage in the dry toilet, inform the person in charge.
